June 23rd - Semi-Annual Congregation Meeting

Please mark your calendars for the Semi-Annual Congregation meeting which will be held after Sunday Service on **June 23**rd. We have several very important action items that need to be considered for approval at this meeting. Please join us - it will be required for us to have a minimum of **45 voting members** available to ensure that this important business can be finalized. The option to attend via Zoom will be available.

Some of the action items on the agenda will be; having the Nomination Team present the slate for open Council seats, election of these new Council members, and approval of the updated Constitution. The main changes from our former Constitution are that our bylaws are now embedded in the document, and we have lowered the quorum number for our congregational meetings from 45 down to 25. This number will be much more manageable with our current active membership. You should be able to preview the constitution by:

<u>June 9th – National Strawberry Rhubarb Pie day!</u>

Celebrate by making your own (great practice for the next Pies for Palms Sunday!)

Ingredients

- homemade or store bought pie crust
- 3 cups sliced **rhubarb** (1/2 inch pieces)
- 2 and 1/2) cups chopped strawberries
- 1/3 cup packed light brown sugar
- 1/3 cup granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup cornstarch
- 1/4 teaspoon salt

- 1 Tablespoon orange juice
- 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 2 Tablespoons unsalted butter, cut into small pieces
- 1 large egg, lightly beaten with
 1 Tablespoon milk
- optional: coarse sugar for garnish
- Make the filling: Stir the rhubarb, strawberries, brown sugar, granulated sugar, cornstarch, salt, orange juice, and vanilla extract together in a large bowl. Set filling aside as the oven preheats.
- Preheat oven to 400°F (204°C).
- Roll out the chilled pie dough: On a floured work surface, roll out one of the discs of chilled dough (keep the other one in the refrigerator). Turn the dough about a quarter turn after every few rolls until you have a circle 12 inches in diameter. Carefully place the dough into a 9-inch pie dish. Tuck it in with your fingers, making sure it is smooth. Spoon the filling into the crust, leaving all of the excess liquid in the bowl (you don't want that in the filling—discard it). Dot the pieces of butter on top of the filling.
- Arrange the lattice: Remove the other disc of chilled pie dough from the refrigerator. Roll the dough into a circle that is 12 inches diameter. Using a pastry wheel, sharp knife, or pizza cutter, cut strips 1/2-to 1-inch wide. Carefully thread the strips over and under one another, pulling back strips as necessary to weave. Press the edges of the strips into the bottom pie crust edges to seal. Use a small knife to trim off excess dough. Crimp the pie crust edges with a fork, if desired. (Alternatively, you can simply cover the filling with the 12-inch pie dough circle. Cut slits in the top to form steam vents. Trim and crimp the edges. Or a crumble or streusel topping would be great.)
- Lightly brush the top of the pie crust with the egg/milk mixture. Sprinkle the top with a little coarse sugar, if desired.
- Place the pie onto a large baking sheet and bake for 20 minutes. Keeping the pie in the oven, turn the
 temperature down to 350°F (177°C) and bake for an additional 30-35 minutes. After the first 20
 minutes of bake time, I place a pie crust shield on top of the pie to prevent the edges from browning
 too quickly.
- Allow the pie to cool for 3 full hours at room temperature before serving. This time allows the filling to thicken up. Cover leftovers tightly and store in the refrigerator for up to 5 days.
